

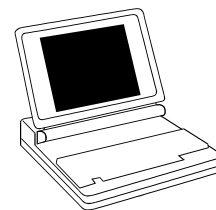

Financial ratios measuring factors which contribute to creditworthiness such as liquidity, capital productivity, return on assets, interest coverage, capital adequacy and excess cash flow are provided. Ideal reference for credit managers, financial analysts and business managers. For each highlighted company, a Z-score corporate credit worthiness value calculated from the latest published quarterly financial statements is listed as well as an estimate for four quarters in the future. The study highlights the least creditworthy firms based on future Z scores, the most eroding credit based on expected change in Z scores, and the most underperforming company in each industry group based on difference of Z score from the group average. Each monthly edition of the Excel data files includes current values for the measures as well as projections for four fiscal quarters into the future.

Financial Baseline Forecasts

This series of monthly PDF reports presents forecasts of near term corporate financial performance for over 4,000 individual companies in eleven major industry sectors. Forecasts for each company include for the next four quarters: sales, earnings, dividends, cash flows, debt, profit margins and rates of return.

These baseline forecasts represent a reasonable forecast of near term financial performance given publicly available historical data on each firm, its competitors and industry, the historical behavior of the stock market and the firm's relationship to the stock market. Using these forecasts, along with a valuation model which determines how the market has valued this company in the past in terms of its measures of financial return, a forecast of near term future fair market value is presented. Also included is growth rate analysis, share analysis, market value analysis and risk analysis. The risk analysis includes market value beta, dividend coverage ratio, liability to equity ratio, takeover index, z-score and variation in sales, operating income, cost of capital, earnings per share, cash flow per share, and share price.

Rankings by growth in earnings per share, growth in cash flow per share, annual revenues, annual net income, share of market value to share of net income are made and the top 30 companies and bottom 30 in each sector are listed.

Designed for professionals to track competitors, manage money, spot industry trends, write industry reports, avoid bad credit risks, audit investments and spot acquisition candidates. This is an ideal reference for investment analysts, strategic planners, money managers, management consultants, CFOs, M&A specialists, economists, CEOs and new business directors.

SG&A Benchmarks is a series of PDF reports published by Schonfeld & Associates for use as a convenient source of information for professional managers seeking benchmark information on the Selling, General & Administrative spending practices of major public corporations within specific industry sectors.

Each title within the **SG&A Benchmarks** series is produced for a specific industry sector. The sector summary chart provides a side by side comparison of 10%ile, median and 90%ile values for each industry within the sector. For each industry within the sector, individual companies are listed with their historical SG&A to Sales percentage and growth rates in sales and spending for the past year. For use in setting and evaluating budgets, estimates are given for the current year SG&A to Sales percentage and expected growth in sales and SG&A spending. To allow for easy identification of relative performance within each industry, individual companies are grouped by size based on sales. The firms are presented in three groups as defined by sales of less than \$100 million, sales between \$100 million and \$1 billion, and sales of more than \$1 billion. Since location and annual sales may be of interest, total annual sales and headquarters city are also reported

The tables for each individual industry present values for both last year and this year of SG&A as a percentage of sales and the annual percentage growth rate in SG&A spending as well as in sales for each company within the industry. Comparing the growth rate of SG&A expenses and sales gives a snapshot of where the profitability of the firm may be heading.

Two sets of industry tabulations are presented. Alphabetical order by company name aids in locating a firm. Order by SG&A to Sales ratio showcases the 'leaner and meaner' firms in each industry.

This report will benefit anyone seeking competitive benchmark intelligence including: corporate staff, financial analysts, investment professionals, lenders, M&A advisors, appraisers and industry consultants.
